#### Creating an Imaginary Self through Sculpture with Akiko Jackson

Let's think of the self-portrait in an extraordinary way! In this course, artists will become familiar with body casting their hands, feet, fingers, and/or toes. With these physical extremities, we will create an imaginative self and/or alter-ego and/or creature. Fabric, paper, and found natural objects will be used for the bulk of the main body, adding plaster-cast extremities (hand, foot, finger, toe) last. Who will your imaginary self be?!

#### Monsters and the Monstrous with Nora Corrigan

Zombies, aliens, vampires, and cold-blooded killers—they all make for thrilling figures, but they can also be useful tools for accessing and representing aspects of our lives which, if taken head on, allude us. Together, we will analyze how and why writers and artists have created their monstrosities. You will then use these techniques to create your own monsters, and through these creations, investigate your worlds and experiences. You might choose to craft a graphic novel, or a purely visual narrative, or a novella, or short stories, or flash fiction—whatever suits your interests and talents! By the end of the class you will have a body of work to share with one another and horrify your friends.
